


Figure 1: GXV3350 Package Content




Figure 2: GXV3350 Front and GBX20 Extension Module Front




Figure 3: GXV3350 Back View

Connecting and Setting Up the GXV3350

The GXV3350 can be installed on the desktop using the built-in stand or attached on the wall using the slots for wall mounting.

Using the Phone Stand

The GXV3350 has a phone stand. To set up the GXV3350 as your desk phone, follow the steps below:

- 1. For installing the phone on the table with the phone stand, attach the phone stand to the bottom of the phone where there is a slot for the phone stand, (upper half, bottom part);
- 2. Connect the handset and main phone case with the phone cord;
- 3. Connect the LAN port of the phone to the RJ-45 socket of a hub/switch or a router (LAN side of the router) using the Ethernet cable;
- 4. Connect the 12V DC output plug to the power jack on the phone; plug the power adapter into an electrical outlet. If PoE switch is used in step 3, this step could be skipped;

The LCD will display the booting up screen or firmware upgrading information. Before continuing, please wait for the main screen display to show up.




Figure 4: Phone Stand and Mounting Slots on GXV3350

Using the Slots for Wall Mounting (Wall Mount *Sold Separately)

- 1. Attach the wall mount to the slots for wall mount spaces on the back of the phone;
- 2. Attach the phone to the wall via the wall mount hole;
- 3. Pull out the tab from the handset cradle (see figure below);
- 4. Rotate the tab and plug it back into the slot with the extension up to hold the handset while the phone is mounted on the wall.
- 5. Connect the handset and main phone case with the phone cord;
- 6. Connect the LAN port of the phone to the RJ-45 socket of a hub/switch or a router (LAN side of the router) using the Ethernet cable;




Figure 5: Tab on The Handset Cradle

Connecting the GXV3350

To setup your GXV3350, please follow the steps below:

- 1. Connect the handset and main phone case with the phone cord;
- 2. Connect the LAN port of the phone to the RJ-45 socket of a hub/switch or a router (LAN side of the router) using the Ethernet cable;
- 3. Connect the 12V DC output plug to the power jack on the phone; plug the power adapter into an electrical outlet. If PoE switch is used in step 2, this step could be skipped;
- 4. The LCD will display booting up or firmware upgrading information. Before continuing, please wait for the main screen display to show up;
- 5. Using the web configuration interface or from the menu of the touch screen, you can further configure network connection using static IP, DHCP etc.




Figure 6: GXV3350 Back / Side View

GBX20 Extension Module

The GXV3350 uses GBX20 as the extension module. The extension module is an ideal solution for the busy enterprise environment looking to add the ability to receive and dispatch calls efficiently.





Each GBX20 extension module has 20 programmable buttons, Left and Right buttons, supporting 40 Multiple Purpose Keys to be configured. GXV3350 supports up to 4 extension modules, adding 160 fully programmable phone extensions to the phone.

- 2. In case two or more GBX20 extension modules are connected to the GXV3350, the second GBX20 needs to be powered on by a 12V/1A PSU.

Installing the GBX20 to GXV3350

To set up the GBX20 with the GXV3350, please follow the steps below:

1. On the back of the GBX20 and the GXV3350 there are slots for connector plate. Attach the connector plate between the slots for the GBX20, Apply the screw provided and securely tighten the connector plate to the GBX20 (see figure below).




Figure 7: GBX20 with connector

2. Attach the other side of the connector plate to the GXV3350's EXT slots like shown in the figure below:




Figure 8: Connect GXV3350 and GBX20





- 3. Connect the GBX20 to the GXV3350 via the USB port using the USB cable provided with the GBX20.
- 4. Install the phone stands on the GXV3350 and the GBX20.
- 5. Power up the GXV3350. The GBX20 will show the booting up screen with version information and connecting status.
- 6. After successfully booting up, the extension board will stay in idle. Press and hold the LEFT and RIGHT button at the same time to check the version information and status.

The GBX20 can be configured via the web GUI of the GXV3350 connected. After successfully configured, press LEFT and RIGHT button on the GBX20 and users could browse all the Programmable Keys' status in different pages.

Cleaning the Phone

For daily dust removal and fingerprint removal, please use the screen cleaning cloth in the factory package to wipe the phone. Before you clean the touchscreen, we recommend turning cleaning mode on, so that you will not activate phone functions while wiping the touchscreen.

You can go to **LCD Settings** → **Basic** → **Accessibility** to enable cleaning mode. Once finished, you can enable the touchscreen again by pressing any hardkey on the phone.

For some special cases like medical environment, you can use medical alcohol or isopropanol. The steps are as followed:

- 1. Before cleaning the phone, stop using it and disconnect it from the power supply.
- 2. Spray a small amount of disinfectant on screen, camera, handle and other places that are easily touched by users.
- 3. Wipe the phone with screen cleaning cloth.
- 4. Power on until the disinfectant is completely volatilized.

Notes:

- Keep the power plug clean and dry, or may lead to electric shock or other perils.
- DO NOT use disinfectant too frequently.
- DO NOT use high degree or even pure disinfectant. It could damage the phone.





GETTING TO KNOW GXV3350

Use the Touchscreen

When the phone boots up in HOME screen, the LCD will display as below. A registered account is shown in the following figure and users might need register their own account to have the account status displayed.



Swipe from right to show the application menu of the phone. The settings and applications installed will be brought up as shown below.




Figure 10: GXV3350 Onscreen Menu





To fully manipulate the GXV3350 capacitive touch screen, use your fingers to operate the following on the GXV3350 icons, buttons, menu items, onscreen keyboard etc.




Figure 11: GXV3350 Finger Gestures on the Touch Screen

Tap

Slightly touch the screen with fingertip to initiate menu, options or applications. For example, to select items on the screen (e.g., setting options, apps etc.); to press onscreen buttons (e.g., "End" or "Options" softkey during the call); to type letters and symbols using the onscreen keyboard.

Long Press

Touch the screen with fingertip and press for about 2 seconds without lifting your finger from the screen till an action occurs. For example, long press on a picture to bring up selection option.

Flick and Slide

Touch the screen with fingertip and slide over the screen. For example, user could slide up to scroll up the page, slide down to open dropdown menu, slide left or slide right to delete an item from the list. If your finger stays on the screen for too long, the item may be selected, and sliding won't occur.

Press and Drag

Touch and press the item, then move it by dragging it up, down, left or right, without lifting your finger from the screen.





Zoom In/Zoom Out

Place two fingers on the screen, then pinch them together (zoom out) or spread them apart (zoom in).

Double Tap

Quickly touch the screen twice with fingertip to switch between default display and zoomed-in display. This is usually used when viewing photos or web pages.

Use the Desktop

Desktop Menu

When the GXV3350 is on idle screen, press the MENU key \equiv to bring up phone's menu. Users can access the following in the desktop menu:




Figure 12: GXV3350 Desktop Menu

Desktop page

Add, delete or edit desktop pages, set Home page and change the screen sequence.

Wallpaper

Select wallpaper from Local gallery or from the available system Wallpapers

Widgets

Add widgets to the desktop by touching and holding the widget from the widget menu.

Management

Manage running applications on the GXV3350. For more details, please refer to section [*Manage Running Applications*].





Add Widget to Desktop

The GXV3350 provides widgets like account bar, clock, contacts etc. Users could conveniently add those widgets to the desktop as preferred. To add a widget:

- 1. Press the Menu key or long press on an empty space on the idle screen and select "Widgets".
- 2. Different widgets will be displayed on the right side of the screen.
- 3. Select and drag the widget to the desired spot to be placed on the desktop. Please make sure there is enough space on the desktop. Otherwise, the widget won't be added.




Figure 13: Add Widget to the Desktop

Manage Desktop Items

On the GXV3350 desktop, users could tap on the desktop items to manage shortcuts and widgets. The following operations can be done:

• Tap on the shortcut icon to open the application.

For example, tap on "File Manager" icon to access file manager application.

Tap on the widget to open and edit it.

For example, tap on the digital clock on the desktop. The clock settings will be brought up for users to set up timer, stopwatch or alarm.








Figure 14: Open Clock Widget

• Certain widgets such as the MPK Widget can be resized on the desktop.

To resize a widget, press and hold the widget for about 2 seconds. Then lift your finger from the screen. This will bring up the white frame as shown in the following figure. Touch and drag the border of the frame to adjust the size.

• Move/delete Application/Widget

To move a shortcut/widget to a different spot on the desktop or to a different idle screen, touch and press the item for about 1 seconds until a recycle bin icon shows up on the top of the screen. Drag the item up/down/left/right to the destination spot on the screen. Lift your finger once done. To delete the item/widget, press on it for about 1 seconds then move it to the recycle bin on the top of the screen.

Auto Adjust Screen

This app is running in background and automatically triggered when the user opens a third-party app, such as YouTube, Skype, Zoom, Teams, etc, so that app layout would be correct. When the user goes back to the LCD desktop, the app adjusts the screen back to normal.

Set Wallpapers

On the GXV3350 desktop, touch and press on an empty spot for about 2 seconds or users could press menu key \equiv and select "Wallpaper" to set up the wallpaper for the desktop. Users could select wallpaper from different categories:

Local

Open Gallery application and tap on the picture to preview. Touch and drag the picture to adjust the frame that will be used as wallpaper. Then tap on "Set Wallpaper" to set the selected area of the picture as wallpaper.

Wallpapers

On the right side of the Wallpaper menu of the GXV3350. Select the picture from the default wallpapers available to preview and then tap on "Set wallpaper".

⚠ Note:

Deleting an application icon will systematically pop up a window asking the permission to uninstall the application from the screen. Press ok to uninstall or press cancel to abort.




Figure 18: GXV3350 Choose Wallpaper




Figure 21: Set up Home Idle Screen




Figure 22: Add an Idle Screen




Figure 25: Status Bar - More Options




Figure 26: GXV3350 Top Status Bar - Notification




Figure 27: GXV3350 Top status Bar - Get more information




Figure 28: GXV3350 Top status Bar - Wi-Fi




Figure 29: System Settings in Status Bar




Figure 30: GXV3350 Keys

Keypad Shortcut Functions

Screenshot

Press and hold the Home button for about 2 seconds to capture screenshot. The screenshot can be accessed via **File Manager > Pictures**. The screenshot picture size is 1024x600 pixels.

Firmware upgrade via USB

For users that could not use remote upgrade or could not access the phone's Web GUI to upload firmware, upgrading via external USB is an alternative. Follow the steps below to upgrade GXV3350 via USB.

- 1. Download the firmware file to PC and save it in USB.
- 2. Insert the USB to GXV3350.
- 3. Power cycle the GXV3350.
- 4. Wait for the LED in the upper right of the phone to light up in Green, then about 2 seconds later press the both keys "3" and " * " at the same time, it will go into the upgrading process.





- 5. The GXV3350 will start upgrading and display the upgrading process in the screen.
- 6. Wait until the upgrading is done.
- 7. The GXV3350 will reboot itself.
- 8. Check the firmware status and remove the USB.

Hard reset

For users that want to factory reset the device manually, hard reset is an alternative:

- 1. Power cycle the GXV3350.
- 2. Wait for the LED in the upper right of the phone to light up in Green, then about 2 seconds, press the both keys "1" and "9" at the same time, it will go into the factory reset process.
- 3. The LCD screen will display "Factory reset, please wait".
- 4. The GXV3350 will reboot with factory default settings.

Use the On-Screen Keyboard

Register SIP Accounts

The GXV3350 supports up to 16 independent SIP accounts. Each account can have separate SIP servers, usernames and NAT configurations.

Account Status

On the idle screen, the account widget shows the account name, and registration status.

- The following figure shows the account is successfully registered (account icon is green).
- If the account icon is grey, it's still trying to register or unable to register.

Configure SIP Account

To register a SIP account, users can access phone's LCD menu→Settings→Advanced →Account Settings

Or users could log in the GXV3350 web GUI → **Account** page to fill in the necessary registration information, i.e., Account active, Account name, SIP Server, SIP User ID, SIP Authentic ID, SIP Authentic Password, etc. Once the correct information is entered and saved, the account registration status will show on the main screen.



For web GUI login and configuration information, please refer to GXV3350 Administration Guide.

If the account is successfully registered, users could use one of the following ways to bring up dial screen to start making calls.

- Take the handset off hook.
- Select an account from the account widget in the idle screen.
- On the shortcut's menu of the idle screen, tap on icon to open dial screen.




Figure 36: GXV3350 Dial Screen





If Enable Video Call option is disabled, the Video Call option on GXV3350 dial screen won't be available




Figure 37: Disable Video Call Feature on Dial Screen

Dial a Number Directly

- 1. Use the methods mentioned above to open dial screen [Figure 36: GXV3350 Dial Screen].
- 2. Select the account to dial out on the left panel of the dial screen. The selected account will be displayed in green
- 3. Choose the call mode to be used (call, paging or IP call), the call mode used will be displayed under the account.
- 4. Enter the digits to be dialed out using the keypad. If the digit matches call history, a list of numbers will be displayed for users to select from.
- 5. Tap on (audio call only) or (video call) to send the number. If no key is pressed, by default the call will be automatically dialed out after 4 seconds timeout.





⚠ Note:

- By default, the "No Key Entry Timeout" is 4 seconds, meaning if no key is pressed after entering a
 number, the call will be automatically sent out after the timeout. The timeout interval can be configured
 under web GUI->Account->Call Settings.
- GXV3350 allows users to press # key as SEND key. This behavior can be disabled via option "Use # as Dial Key" under web GUI→Account→Call Settings.
- GXV3350 allows users to press # key as REDIAL key. This behavior can be disabled via option "Use # as Redial Key" under Web GUI→Account→Call Settings.
- When the user enters the digit on the dial screen, if there is digit matching call history, or contacts name/number, the drop-down list will show the numbers. For example, if "John" is saved in the contacts,
- entering 5 (JKL) 6 (MNO) 4 (GHI) 6 (MNO) will show call log with 5646 as the first four digits, as well
 as John's number. Users could then directly select one of them from the list, instead of entering all the
 digits.

Redial

Users can dial out the last dialed number if there is dialed call log, using the same SIP account making the call last time.

- 1. Enter the dial screen.
- 2. A list of dialed calls will be displayed on the left side of the dial pad. Tap on the number you would like to call, the number will be added to the dialing field, press Audio call or Video call to redial.

Dial a Number via Contact

Follow the steps below to dial a number via Contact.

- 1. Access Contacts by tapping on icon on the left side of the idle screen.
- 2. Navigate in the contacts entries by sliding up/down on the screen.
- 3. Tap on the dial icon for the contact .








Figure 38: GXV3350 View Contacts

Dial a Number via Call History

- 1. Access Call History by tapping on icon on the bottom of the idle screen.
- 2. The LCD will display all call history types: "All", "Missed", "Outgoing" and "Incoming" calls.
- 3. Navigate in the call history list by selecting the call history category and sliding up/down on the screen.
- 4. Tap on the entry to show more details or tap on to dial out.




Figure 39: GXV3350 Call History





Direct IP Call

Direct IP Call allows two phones to talk to each other in an ad-hoc fashion without a SIP proxy. VoIP calls can be made between phones if:

- Both phones have public IP addresses, Or
- Both phones are on the same LAN/VPN using private or public IP addresses, Or
- Both phones can be connected through a router using public or private IP addresses (with necessary port forwarding or DMZ).

To make a direct IP call, please follow the steps below:

- 1. Directly enter the 192*168*xxx*xxx through the Number Buttons in the idle screen to bring up dial screen on GXV3350.
- 2. Set the call mode as "IP Call".
- 3. Input the target IP address. For example, if the target IP address is 192.168.0.116 and the port is 5062 (i.e., 192.168.0.116:5062), input the following:
 - 192*168*0*116#5062. The * key represents the dot (.) and the # key represents the colon (:).
- 4. Press on Audio call (audio call only) or Video call) to dial.

Answer a Call

Single Incoming Call

 When the phone is in idle and there is an incoming audio call, the phone will show the call screen as below. Tap on "Answer" softkey to answer the call via speaker or pick up the handset the answer the call.




Figure 40: Single Incoming Call – Audio





• When the phone is in idle and there is an incoming video call, the phone will show the call screen as below. To answer the call with audio only, tap on "Audio" to answer the call via speaker. To answer the call with both audio and video, tap on "Video". During video call or pick up the handset, the audio will switch to handset if picking up the handset.




Figure 41: Single Incoming Call - Video

Note: Users could select the Video Display Mode on phone's Web UI \rightarrow Phone Settings \rightarrow Video Settings. Set the video display mode to "Original proportion", "Cut proportionally" or "Add black margin proportionally".

If set to "**Original proportion**", the phone displays video in its original proportion. If the video display proportion is different from the one on the phone, the phone will stretch or compress video to display it. If set to "**Cut proportionally**", the phone will cut video to meet its own display proportion. If set to "**Add black margin proportionally** ", the phone will display video in its original proportion, if still exists spare space, the phone will add black edge on it.

Preview Function for Incoming Call

• If the phone set the "Preview" feature for the incoming call from Web UI, the phone will display one more key "Preview" when there is an incoming video call. End users will preview the remote end without answering the video call. After previewing, end user can tap on Answer key to answer the video call, or "Reject" key to reject it. This feature should be supported by the SIP server. Please contact service provider for more information.








Figure 42: Single Incoming Call - Preview-1




Figure 43: Single Incoming Call – Preview-2

Transfer Function for Incoming Call

• If the phone set the "Transfer" feature for the incoming call from Web UI, the phone will display one more key "Transfer" when there is an incoming call. End users will have the possibility to transfer the call without answering. After pressing "Transfer" button, end user can enter manually destination or press "MPK" to select a destination. "Reject" key to reject it. This feature should be supported by the SIP server. Please contact service provider for more information.








Figure 44: Single Incoming Call - Transfer-1




Figure 45: Single Incoming Call - Transfer-2

Multiple Calls/Call Waiting

When there is another incoming call during active call, users will hear a call waiting tone, with the LCD displaying the caller name and ID for the incoming call. In the prompt window, it shows new incoming call from "316307" with the caller number; the account bar in purple is the current active call with "316307".








Figure 46: Call Waiting

- 2. Similar to single incoming call, if the incoming call is video call, users can choose to "Audio Answer" or to "Video Answer" to answer the call.
- 3. Once the new call is answered, the current active call will be placed on hold. If the new call is rejected by tapping on "Reject" softkey, the current active call will not be interrupted.

Call Progress Status

During an active call if Home Button is pressed, the phone will go back to the home screen and the call-in-progress status will be shown on the GXV3350 status bar, once clicking the bar it will go back to call screen.

Call Hold

During the active call, press HOLD softkey. The LCD screen will show as below. To resume the call, press UNHOLD softkey on the bottom of the screen.




Figure 48: Call on Hold

Call Recording

- 1. During the call, users could record the conversation to the phone by tapping on "Record"
- 2. If need to stop the recording, tap on "Stop Recording"
- 3. The recording files can be retrieved from the GXV3350 Web GUI→Applications→Recording.

Note:

Users can configure the recording mode via Web GUI→Phone Settings→Call Settings→Record Mode.

Five modes are available:

- **Record Locally:** The phone will use the local recorder for call recording, and the audio file will be saved according to the recorder setup.
- Record on PortaOne: The phone will send the specified SIP messages to the corresponding server
- **Record on UCM:** The phone will send the recording feature code to the UCM server to request for recording, and the recording function will be executed by the server.
- **Record on BroadSoft:** The phone will send the recording feature code to the Broadsoft server to request for recording, and the recording function will be executed by the server.
- **Disable:** The phone cannot record in a call.

Users can configure the phone to Auto-Record all calls established via Web GUI→Phone Settings→Call Settings→Enable Auto Record When Call Established. But, if Record Mode is set to "Disable", this option cannot be configured.

MPK Monitoring

During the call, users could view and monitor the programmable keys configured for the current Account:




Figure 50: MPK button

- 2. The list of MPK configured for the active account will be displayed.








Figure 51: MPK list

Mute

During an active call, press "Mute" button to mute the call. The mute icon will be displayed behind the local number on the top of leftof the screen. Press "Mute" button again to unmute the call.




Figure 52: GXV3350 Call Mute





Turn on Video during Audio Call

Users could establish audio call first and then turn on video or accept video request during the call if the other party supports video call as well.

• Turn on video during audio call

During an active audio call, on the call screen, tap on "More" and select "Video On", a video request will be sent to the other party.




Figure 53: Turn on Video During Audio Call




Figure 54: Accept Video During Audio Call





If the GXV3350 receives video request during the audio call, a message "Accept video?" will be prompted. Select "Accept" to establish video during the call. If the **Enable Video Call Feature** is not enabled on GXV3350, the "Video On" option on GXV3350 will be hidden during the audio call. However, if the GXV3350 receives video request during the audio call, users could tap to accept the video request.

Call Details during Call

During an active/video call, on the call screen, tap on "Mode" and select "Call details .




Figure 55: Select Call Details During Video Call




Figure 56: Call Details





Quick DTMF During Call

During an Audio/Video call, users have the ability to show DTMF buttons and each one of them can perform a different action. On the call screen, tap on "Mode" and select "Quick Dtmf".




Figure 57: Select Quick DTMF During Call

This feature can be configured by following below steps:

- 1. Go to GXV3350 Web GUI→Value-added Service→Value-added Service.
- 2. Configure the service type as DTMF and specify its Display Name.
- 3. Set the DTMF content in "DTMF Content" field.
- 4. Repeat the same steps in order to get more DTMF Buttons displayed during the call. See the following figure.




Figure 58: DTMF During Call





Switch Audio Channel During Call

- GXV3350 allows users to switch among handset, speaker or headset(RJ9 headset, Plantronics EHS
 headset and Bluetooth headset) when making calls. Onhook to switch to handset; press the Headset
 button to switch to headset; press the Speaker button to switch to speaker.
- If Bluetooth headset is connected, the audio will be automatically switched to Bluetooth headset once the call is established.
- The status bar on the top of the screen shows the current audio channel being used during the call. If
 pressing the corresponding key for the currently used audio channel, the call will be hang up.

Call Transfer

A call can be transferred to another party during the call. The GXV3350 supports blind transfer and attended transfer.

Blind Transfer

- 1. During the active call, tap on "Transfer" button.
- 2. Select "Transfer" to bring up the transfer screen.




Figure 59: Blind Transfer

- 3. Select transfer mode as "Blind" by tapping on the highlight area [Figure 59: Blind Transfer]. The default transfer mode is "Blind".
- 4. Enter the digits.
- 5. Tap on "Transfer" softkey.
- 6. The call will be transferred and GXV3350 will hang up the call.

⚠ Note:

- If wrong digits are entered, tap on to delete the digit one by one;
- If users would like to cancel the transfer, press button to go back to the previous talking screen.

Attended Transfer

GXV3350 supports attended transfer:

- 1. During the active call, tap on "Transfer" button to bring up transfer screen.
- 2. Select transfer mode as "Attended" by tapping on the mode selection area (see figure below).




Figure 60: Attended Transfer

- 3. Enter the transfer target number, and then press the "Transfer" soft key on the right.




Figure 61: Attended Transfer - Transferring




Figure 62: Attended Transfer - Split




Figure 63: Attended Transfer

Transfer via MPKs




Figure 64: Transfer via MPK




Figure 65: MPK list

- To transfer calls across SIP domains, SIP service providers must support transfer across SIP domains;
- If users would like to cancel the transfer, press button to go back to the previous talking screen.





6-Way Conference

The GXV3350 supports up to 6-way Audio conferencing and 3-way HD Video conferencing.

Initiate Conference

There are three ways to initiate a conference call.

- Initiating conference from dial screen
- 1. Bring up the dial screen using one of the methods described previously [Figure 36: GXV3350 Dial Screen].
- 2. Enter the extension number then press on it on the left panel of the screen




Figure 66: Add Conference Members from Dial Screen

3. The extension number will be added to dialing field and users can dial another number




Figure 67: Add Conference Members from Dial Screen 2




Figure 68: GXV3350 Conference Screen




Figure 69: GXV3350 Conference - Add Existing Call to Conference




Figure 70: 3-Way Conference Call Established




Figure 71: Notification of joining the conference




Figure 72: Notification of exiting the conference

Remove Party from Conference




Figure 73: GXV3350 Conference - Remove Party from Conference

End Conference

To end the conference, tap on to disconnect all the parties from the conference. GXV3350 will hang up the call. If the remote party hangs up the call itself, it will be disconnected from the conference but other parties on GXV3350 will stay in the existed conference.

Hold and Resume Conference

During the conference, users could tap on Hold to hold the conference at any time. To resume the call tap on Unhold.

Auto Conference Mode

The GXV3350 also supports "Auto Conference" which allows users to establish conference call in a quick and easy way, instead of adding the other parties one by one. To enable Auto Conference feature, go to web GUI->Phone Settings->Call Settings->Call Features and set "Auto Conference" to "Yes".

To esablish call with auto conference when there are 1 or more calls on the GXV3350, simply tap on "Conf" button. All the calls on GXV3350 will be brought into the conference.

UCM Conference

Participate in UCM Conference Room

Users could dial the UCM conference room extension to join the conference. If password is required, enter the password to join the conference as a normal user, or enter the admin password to join the conference as administrator.




Figure 75: UCM conference Menu




Figure 76: Conference Menu Options




Figure 77: Conference's members list




Figure 78: Invite a member




Figure 79: Conference Bridge




Figure 80: Mute all members

Missed Call

When there is a missed call, the LCD will show missed call dialog on the idle screen.

Users can tap on the missed call entry to access the missed call log. To close the missed call screen and return to the idle screen, tap on the screen except the dialog.

DND (Do Not Disturb)

When DND is on, the incoming calls to the GXV3350 will be blocked for all registered accounts with a reminder ring produced. To turn on/off DND:

- 1. Touch and drag the status bar down on the GXV3350 idle screen.
- 2. Tap on the DND icon to turn it on. The status bar shows icon indicating DND is on.
- 3. Tap on the DND icon to turn if off.




Figure 82: Enable/Disable DND

⚠ Note:

- When the phone is in an active call, turning on/off DND won't affect the current active call. It will take effect starting from the next incoming call.
- When DND is on, all the incoming call logs will be saved in Missed.

Voicemail/Message Waiting Indication

When there is a new voicemail, the Message Waiting Indication (MWI) LED icon will blink in red on the upper right corner of the GXV3350 and will show up in the status bar.





To retrieve the voicemail:

- 1. Tap on the Message icon from the applications section to bring up voicemail screen. All the registered accounts and the number of voicemails are displayed there.
- 2. Tap on the account to dial into the voicemail box. Then follow the Interactive Voice Response (IVR) for the message retrieval process.




Figure 83: Retrieve Voicemail

For each account, the Voicemail User ID can be set up under web GUI \rightarrow Account X \rightarrow General Settings: "Voicemail Access Number". This is the number that will be dialed out to access voicemail message when tapping on the account in Voice Mail screen.

Call Forward

Call forward feature can be set up from GXV3350 LCD or Web GUI.

From LCD

Go to onscreen Menu-Settings-Features-Call Forward. Select account name and tap on Call Forwarding to activate the feature. Then the list of options will be available. Select the option Call Forward Mode to configure the call forward type (Unconditional, Time Based, Others) and then enter necessary number in the fields.








Figure 84: Unconditional Call Forward

From Web GUI

Log in GXV3350 web GUI and go to **Account page→Call Settings**. By default, Call Forward feature is set to "None". The Call Forward feature options are:

Unconditional Forward: All the incoming calls will be forwarded to the number set up in "All To" field.




Figure 85: Call Forward – Unconditional




Figure 86: Call Forward - Time Based




Figure 87: Call Forward - Busy/No Answer/DND




Figure 88: GXV3350 Contacts

Local Contacts

The local contacts can save up to 1000 entries. Users can manage contacts by adding, deleting and modifying single contacts, downloading contacts from HTTP/TFTP server, importing contacts from external storage and exporting contacts to external storage.

Note: A reminder prompt is shown on the GXV3350 LCD screen when adding a number of contacts more than the allowed one (when importing contacts for instance).

Add Single Contacts

- On the Local Contacts menu Tap on contact. See figure below.

 to bring up "Create Contact" dialog to manually add a new contact. See figure below.
- 2. Type First name, Last name, Phone number and other information for the new contacts. Please make sure the account number field is selected so the GXV3350 will use this account to dial out the new contact. The account number field is located on the left of the "Phone" filed as highlighted below.








Figure 89: GXV3350 Contacts - Add New Contact




Figure 90: Add to Contacts from Dial Pad

Import/Export Contacts

If the users have the GXV3350 phonebook file saved in local storage or external storage device that has been plugged into the GXV3350, the phonebook file can be directly imported to the Contacts. There are two different formats supported for the phonebook file:"vcard", and "xml". 


Figure 91: GXV3350 Contacts - Import Contacts




Figure 92: GXV3350 Contacts - Export Contacts




Figure 93: GXV3350 Contacts - Download Contacts




Figure 94: GXV3350 Contacts - Search Contacts




Figure 95: GXV3350 Contacts - Select Contacts




Figure 96: Add Contacts to Favorites




Figure 97: GXV3350 Contacts - Add New Group




Figure 98: GXV3350 Contacts - Storage Status




Figure 99: GXV3350 Programmable Key APP - Add Number




Figure 100: GXV3350 Programmable Key APP - Add number from Contacts




Figure 101: GXV3350 Programmable Key APP - Number List




Figure 102: GXV3350 Settings

HARASSMENT INTERCEPTION




Figure 103: List of blocked contacts




Figure 104: Block History




Figure 105: GXV3350 Blacklist - Add Number to Blacklist




Figure 106: Manually Add Number to Blacklist




Figure 107: Intercept Anonymous Calls




Figure 108: GXV3350 Call History




Figure 109: GXV3350 Call History - Options




Figure 110: GXV3350 Call History - Details




Figure 111: GXV3350 SMS Message




Figure 112: View SMS Dialog




Figure 114: SMS Settings




Figure 115: GXV3350 File Manager - Copy File




Figure 116: Paste File




Figure 117: GXV3350 File Manager - Move




Figure 118: GXV3350 File Manager - Options




Figure 119: Delete File(s) via File Manager




Figure 120: Rename File




Figure 121: GS Market - Onscreen Menu




Figure 122: FTP Server – Start




Figure 123: FTP Server - Stop




Figure 124: FTP Server - Settings




Figure 126: General Detection




Figure 127: Audio Detection




Figure 128: GXV3350 Camera




Figure 129: Recent pictures and videos page




Figure 130: Edit picture




Figure 132: GXV3350 Gallery




Figure 134: Screensaver settings




Figure 135: Use Network Images




Figure 136: Network Image Path




Figure 138: GXV3350 Browser Menu Options




Figure 139: Open New Window in Browser




Figure 140: GXV3350 Web Browser-Bookmarks





ACTION URL

GXV3350 supports ActionURL module, and it is used to set the URL for various kinds of phone events on phone web GUI, and when the corresponding event occurs on the phone, phone will send the configured URL to SIP server. To use ActionURL module, users need to know the supported events in this module, and also added the dynamic variables of the supported events on phone web GUI. The dynamic variables of the supported event will be replaced by actual values of the phone, in order to notify the event to SIP server. CONNECTING GXV3350 TO DOOR SYSTEMS

The GXV3350 offers a powerful integration with Door systems (GDS3710 Door System or others) and allows users to open the door, initiates call and gets real time audio/video stream.

In order to configure the GXV3350 with the door system from the phone side, users need to go under GXV3350 Web GUI→Value-added Service→Value-added Service. *Please*, *refer to the GXV3350 Administration Guide for more details about Value-added Service configuration*.

Once the configuration is done, the call from the door system is answered on the GXV3350 in full screen with the configured "Open" button to send the access password to the door system. *Please, refer to the following figure:*




Figure 141: Incoming call from GDS3710 door system

CONNECT TO NETWORK AND DEVICES

The GXV3350 supports a variety of network connections (Ethernet, Wi-Fi) and device connections, including EHS headset (Plantronics), USB and Bluetooth device. Users can connect the GXV3350 and transfer files from/to the GXV3350 using a USB connection or Bluetooth.

Ethernet

Ethernet connection is turned on as DHCP by default. If you would like to use Ethernet connection for network access, please make sure the Ethernet cable is plugged in to the LAN port on the back of the GXV3350.

To configure Ethernet settings on GXV3350 LCD:

- 1. Go to GXV3350's **Settings** → **Network** → **Ethernet Settings**.
- 2. Touch IPv4 settings.
- 3. Tap on "IPV4 Address Type" to select DHCP, Static IP or PPPoE as the address type.
 - > For DHCP, save the setting and the GXV3350 should be able to get IP address from the DHCP server in the network.
 - > For static IP, enter IP Address, Subnet Mask, Default Gateway, DNS Server and Alternative DNS server for the GXV3350 to correctly connect to network.
 - > For PPPoE, enter PPPoE account ID and password so the GXV3350 can get IP address from the PPPoE server.

WI-FI

WI-FI is supported and built-in on the GXV3350. GXV3350 can be connected to network if Wi-Fi is available within the area.

Turn On/Off Wi-Fi

- 1. Go to GXV3350's **Settings**.
- 2. Touch Network.
- 3. Check or uncheck the option for Wi-Fi.

Or, users could open the top status bar and tap on WI-FI icon to turn it on/off.



Connect to Wi-Fi Networks

- 1. Once Wi-Fi is turned on, GXV3350 will automatically start the scanning within the range.
- 2. Go to GXV3350's Settings.





- 3. Touch Network.
- 4. Touch Wi-Fi Settings.
- 5. A list of Wi-Fi networks will be displayed as scanning result. Tap on the SSID and enter the correct password information to connect to the selected Wi-Fi network.
- 6. The phone will start connecting to the Wi-Fi. The status bar will show Wi-Fi signal strength.
- 7. Once it's added and the password is remembered, the GXV3350 will connect to it again when the SSID is within the range.




Figure 142: GXV3350 Connect to Wi-Fi

8. The previous steps allow the GXV3350 to connect the Wi-Fi network with DHCP setting by default. If it needs to be connected the Wi-Fi with static IP settings, please scroll down the setting window and tap to check the "Advanced options". Then the window will show up the IP settings at the bottom. If the Static is selected, the system will require end user to input IP address, Gateway, Network prefix length and DNS 1 and DNS 2 addresses.








Figure 143: GXV3350 Connect to Wi-Fi-Show Advanced Options

- 9. If there is a need to modify the saved Wi-Fi network setting, the end user should tap and long press the SSID bar in the Wi-Fi setting page. The system will pop up a prompt and then users need to tap on "Modify Network". Then, the phone system will pop up a new window to allow user to check the Wi-Fi parameters and change the setting by checking the "Advanced options" at the bottom.
- 10. User can also add Wi-Fi Networks manually if the network is hidden or not showing on the list of scanned SSIDs. User needs to roll down the Wi-Fi settings page and press on "Add network" and then enter the SSID name, Security type and Password.




Figure 144: Wi-Fi - Add network




Figure 145: Wi-Fi Settings Shortcut




Figure 146: Wi-Fi Shortcut - Wi-Fi List

Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a proprietary, open wireless technology standard for exchanging data over short distances from fixed and mobile devices, creating personal area networks with high levels of security. The GXV3350 supports Bluetooth, version 4.2 + EDR. Users could use Bluetooth to transfer files, share contact information with other Bluetooth portable devices, use Bluetooth headset for making calls, switch calls to the GXV3350 from mobile devices using Bluetooth hands-free profile, and listen to media (music or other audio output) from the GXV3350.

To connect to a Bluetooth device, turn on GXV3350's Bluetooth radio first. The first time when using a new Bluetooth device with the GXV3350, "pair" the device with GXV3350 so that both devices know how to connect securely to each other. After that, users could simply connect to a paired device. Turn off Bluetooth if it's not used.

Bluetooth settings are under GXV3350's **Settings→Features→Bluetooth.**

Turn On/Off Bluetooth

- 1. Go to GXV3350's **Settings** → **Features** → **Bluetooth**.
- 2. Check or uncheck Bluetooth option.

Or, users could open the top status bar→ tap on Bluetooth icon to turn it on/off.

Change Bluetooth Device Name

The GXV3350 uses "GXV3350_XXXXXY" as Bluetooth device name by default where "XXXXX" is the last 6 digits of the phone's MAC address and the "Y" is the last 6th digit plus 2. The device name will be visible to other devices when connecting them. Follow the steps below to change the name:

- 1. Go to GXV3350's Settings→Features→Bluetooth
- 2. Turn on Bluetooth.
- 3. Select Additional settings.
- 4. Press "Device name".
- 5. Enter a name and tap on "Rename".

Pair GXV3350 with a Bluetooth Device

Before connecting GXV3350 with other Bluetooth device, users must pair them first. They will stay paired afterwards unless they are unpaired.

1. Go to GXV3350's **Settings** → **Features** → **Bluetooth**





- 2. Turn on Bluetooth.
- 3. Tap **Additional settings** and select "Visible to nearby Bluetooth devices" to make the GXV3350 phone visible to all nearby Bluetooth devices.
- 4. The GXV3350 scans and displays the IDs of all available Bluetooth devices in range. If the device you would like to pair with does not show up in the list (available devices), ensure that the other device is turned on and set to be discoverable.
- 5. If the GXV3350 stops scanning before the other device is ready, press button to scan again.
- 6. Once the Bluetooth device shows up in the result, tap on it to start pairing. Confirm the passkey in the prompted message (if any). Or if passcode is required, please refer to the device's documentation or other procedures to obtain the passcode.




Figure 147: GXV3350 Bluetooth - Paired Device

Unpair a Bluetooth Device

- 1. In the Bluetooth settings, tap on button corresponding to the Bluetooth device.
- 2. Select Unpair.

Bluetooth Settings Shortcut

User can enter the Bluetooth settings by sliding the Status Bar, then long Press on the Bluetooth icon.








Figure 148: Bluetooth Settings Shortcut

Press the letter under Bluetooth icon this will show the list of the paired devices. Press "More Settings" to access the Bluetooth settings.




Figure 149: Bluetooth Setting shortcut 2

EHS Headset

The GXV3350 supports normal RJ9 headset and EHS headset. To use Plantronics EHS headset:

- Go to the GXV3350 Home screen → Settings → Basic → Peripherals: enable option "Plug RJ9/EHS headset"
- 2. Connect EHS Headset to the GXV3350. Insert headset connector into the RJ9 headset port on the back of GXV3350.




Figure 150: EHS headset

USB Headset

The GXV3350 supports the GUV3005/3000 headset. The GUV3000 and GUV3005 are HD USB Headsets that offer high-quality sound. Ideal for remote workers and busy environments, these USB headsets feature a noise cancellation microphone that minimizes background noise to provide crisp HD audio. The headset features multiple call control features such answer/end a call, volume adjustment and mute/unmute. Users can plug in the USB port with the headset and simply use the headset as default media input/output channel. Once the headset plugged and tap on the Headset button, it will be detected, then the following icon will be shown on the top right of the status bar, this means a USB headset is connected.








Figure 151: USB Headset Connected




Figure 152: USB Headset Used for Call

USB

The GXV3350 supports USB connection with USB storage devices. To connect and access USB storage device:

- 1. Insert an USB storage device into USB port at the back of the GXV3350.
- 2. It will take a few seconds for the GXV3350 to prepare the connection. Then the USB storage icon will show on the status bar.
- 3. To access USB storage, go to GXV3350 MENU→File Manager → USB. Tap on it to access and manage your data.




Figure 153: USB Storage Device Connected to GXV3350





EMERGENCY CALL

Users could configure Emergency Call Numbers on GXV3350 Web GUI →System Application→Contacts→General Settings, in order to still being able to call those numbers even when the phone is locked. Emergency call interface can be accessed by tapping on "EMERGENCY" under the GXV3350 locked screen. Please, refer to the following figure:

Once "EMERGENCY" is pressed, a dial screen will show and users can choose the numbers allowed to be dialed from the list on the left of the dial screen.




Figure 155: Emergency Dial Screen
